Lent Protest Against Cumbria Coal Mine



On the first day of Lent, vicars and other members of Christian Climate Action (CCA) gathered at key locations across the country calling for an end to plans to open a new coal mine in Cumbria.

In Leeds, Manchester and Newcastle, CCA convened outside the offices of Ward Hadaway, lawyers for West Cumbria Mining Limited, while in London they made their way to the headquarters of Javelin Global Commodities, which has an exclusive marketing and offtake agreement with West Cumbria Mining. Holding banners with the message 'Coal is killing humanity', CCA delivered letters asking the organisations to end their involvement with West Cumbria Mining and cut their ties to the proposed plans.

In London, Rev Vanessa Elston and Rev Helen Burnett also held a service of lament outside the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities, calling for planning permission for the mine to be overturned. During the service, crosses were marked on people's foreheads, using both traditional ashes and coal dust.

Planting Trees on Church of England Land

Martin Luther is reputed to have said that if the world were to end tomorrow, today he would go out and plant an apple tree. In this spirit a group from CCA, together with a group of Triratna Buddhists, spent last weekend planting trees at Summer Berry Farm in the Diocese of Chichester.

Over 1,000 native trees, Oaks, Sweet Chestnuts, Field Maples, Aspens, Alders, Hazels, Dog Roses and many others, will soon be growing in the clay soils of West Sussex as part of a project to encourage the church to use its land more sustainably.

Supporting Indigenous Communities

CCA has been supporting people from the front line of the climate crisis who have been visiting the UK to demand climate justice.

Following our <u>Saturday Session</u> on 14th January with indigenous leaders Pastor Peter Kallang and Celine Lim,



hearing about the felling of the Borneo rainforest and the part that the UK plays in this destruction, CCA joined Celine and fellow Sarawak activist Komeok Joe in London.

CCA took part in their powerful solidarity rainforest ritual-ceremony in the Turbine Hall of the Tate Modern art gallery before walking with them in procession to the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office and on to Buckingham Palace, where letters were delivered to the UK Government and to King Charles.

Forthcoming Actions

Church Divestment Day of Action 5th March 2023



Following CCA giving notice to the Catholic and Anglican churches that they plan to take action in cathedrals across the country on 5th March, calling the Church to break their links with fossil fuels, more and more dioceses have announced they are divesting.

The Diocese of London Bishop's Council have voted for disinvestment, a very welcome development after a series of actions by CCA at St Paul's Cathedral and over a year of negotiation. At the time of writing, good news has also come from the Bishop's Council for Lichfield and the Ely and Rochester dioceses.

This shows the impact CCA is having through peaceful protest and vigils in and outside cathedrals, at Synod and Lambeth Palace, as well has having meetings with Commissioners, writing letters and working with Operation Noah and Young Christian Climate Network.

Engagement with fossil fuel companies companies and continuing to invest Church funds and pensions in fossil fuels is no longer an option; BP have announced they will continue investing their record-breaking profits (\$27.7 billion) in oil and gas rather than use the profits to reinvest in green transition and they are not alone.

On Sunday 5th March 2023 action will still be going ahead at dioceses who have either not divested, or whose divestment is an act of financial "prudence" without a committment not to reinvest. If you would like to get involved, there are a range of actions you can take, either alone or with others, from holding a vigil outside a cathedral to praying inside.

From 21st to 24th April 100,000 people will surround the Houses of Parliament

In previous editions of this newsletter, we've been encouraging everyone to join The Big One: planned to be the UK's biggest climate protest yet. We're working to bring 100,000 people together outside the Houses of Parliament in London - taking our call for change directly to those in power.

The protest is going to be at its biggest for the four days of 21st to the 24th April. However the idea is that the protest will also continue after this.
