EXHIBITING THE REALITY OF CLIMATE CRISIS



Last month, five Christian Climate Action women held a prayerful climate change protest inside the National Gallery in London

They knelt and stood in front of the 15th century painting by Filippino Lippi, Virgin and Child, which depicts Mary seated in a landscape feeding Jesus. The activists held up a version of the painting altered to show a climate-ravaged landscape.

The women, who are mothers and grandmothers, began their protest by singing an adaptation of 'Silent Night', then spoke for the world's children as victims of war and climate injustice before holding a silent, prayerful presence.

Although the original painting was not touched, the public were told to leave the area immediately. A member of staff snatched the poster away, but later apologised and offered it back. The public were clearly interested, but were prevented from taking leaflets which providing more information.

As long as dioceses and charities continue to bank with Barclays, this gives the bank social license and political influence, as it is presenting itself as a bank associated with positive causes, instead of one which is bankrolling climate collapse.

If these are organisations which are committed to social wellbeing and making a positive impact, help us urge them to put their money where their mouths are and move away from this destructive bank.

March to Farnborough Airport



Saturday 27th Jan 2024 11:00am - 4.00pm

Farnborough Airport is already Europe's busiest private jet hub. It is now looking to expand to allow 40% more capacity, flying in the face of the Paris agreement.

A flight in a private jet is roughly 30 to 40 times more harmful to the environment per passenger mile than one in a normal passenger plane.

This march, which is being run by Extinction Rebellion UK and some partner groups including Farnborough Noise, Blackwater Valley Friends of the the Earth and Alton Climate Action Network, is demanding an end to private flights and expansion.



Ben's Charges Dropped After Year with a Tag

CCA Bristol member, Ben, has had a charge for criminal damage dropped - but only after wearing a tag for a year.

Ben was charged with damaging pigeon netting during an action with Animal Rebellion, to which he pleaded not guilty. The tracking tag was combined with a curfew restricting Ben to his home at night. In addition to this severe limitation on his freedom, the tag often malfunctioned, resulting in Ben being disturbed in the middle of the night by the authorities who believed that he had broken the curfew.
