## Huge Progess in Church Stance on Fossil Fuels



The Church of England has announced that it is divesting from fossil fuels, an undertaking that comes after years of action by Christian Climate Action (CCA) on this issue.

By the end of 2023 the Church plans to have removed its $£ 10.3$ billion investments from all oil and gas companies unless they are in genuine alignment with limiting global temperatures to 1.5 C above pre-industrial levels, a threshold which may have already been passed.

CCA's efforts to pursuade the Church of England on this point have included multiple actions at St Pauls (one pictured above) as well as actions at Westminster Abbey, Southwark, Lichfield, Wells, Derby, Exeter, Cardiff and Bristol cathedrals, York Minster, Lambeth Palace, several Synods and Church House, home of the Church Commissioners in London.

Val King, who has been central to CCA's church divestment campaign said: "This is a landmark step, one which may now give the Church of England the freedom and moral authority to speak out against the damage which fossil fuel companies are causing to God's world."

In addition, earlier this month, the Scottish Episcopal Church Synod met in Edinburgh to vote on whether to adopt a Net Zero Plan. CCA Scotland were there to pray for the clergy and laity, and engaged with most of the Synod members over the day's proceedings.

Objective 10 in the Net Zero Plan motion was to build a movement and CCA Scotland encouraged Synod members in this, highlighting that combating climate change requires change at all levels, including individuals, communities, local authorities, Holyrood, Westminster, businesses, and more. CCA members were also encouraging the Synod to get behind Christian Aid's loss and damage campaign and were delighted that the Synod voted to adopt the Net Zero Action Plan with an $80 \%$ majority.

## Christians Arrested Urging Government to Just Stop Oil



Eight members of CCA caused traffic disruption, and five were later arrested, marching to demand that the British Government halt all licences and consents for new oil, gas and coal projects.

The activists marched slowly in the road near West Kensington Station, carrying placards saying "For God's Sake, Just Stop Oil" and "Praying for a Future for Our Children". They later marched again in Parliament Square where at least five were subsequently arrested.

The group included three Anglican priests, a charity worker, a software developer and a retired teacher.
