More Missed Opportunties



There were more missed opportunities in the fight against climate change as the United Nation's COP27 summit in Egypt came close to collapse at points. Not enough countries were ready to make progress, for example on the commitment to limit temperatures to 1.5 C. There are signs of a dawning recognition that this target will not be achieved.

The talks were held in the context of tight security and surveillance and restrictions on protest by activists, while fossil fuel delegates were present in force, up 25% on last year. Unsurprisingly, the text of the final agreement clearly protects the oil and gas petrostates and fossil fuels industries. While there is still reference to phasing down the use of coal as agreed at COP26, this was not extended to phasing down all fossil fuels as some countries had hoped and a resolution to cause emissions to peak by 2025 was taken out. Ambiguous new language in the text about "low emissions and renewable energy" could also encourage the development of further gas resources as gas produces less emissions than coal and many countries at COP27 were hoping to strike lucrative gas deals.

More positively, COP27 did achieve an historic deal for rich countries to pay poorer countries for damage and economic losses caused by climate change. This hugely symbolic and political statement can be seen as the most important climate advance since the Paris Agreement in 2015, as it acknowledges climate inequality. However, the details and solid financial commitments still need to be worked out.

COP28 will be held in November 2023. But with so little political will for change on offer this year (despite soaring summer temperatures and floods across a third of Pakistan) and another petrostate – the United Arab Emirates - playing host, the question is: what it will take to make this summit the truly game-changing event it needs to be?

Christians Join Call to Cut Ties With Fossil Fuels

Members of CCA, including five CofE priests, protested outside BAE Systems headquarters and Church House, both in London, over both organisations' links to the fossil fuel industry. They called on the organisations to "cut the ties" with fossil fuels.

The protests were part of a larger action that took place across 13 locations associated with organisations which have links to the fossil fuel industry. The actions followed the conclusion of COP27 in Egypt, which has been widely criticised for the heavy presence of representatives of oil and gas companies.

Could You Be a Prayer Buddy?



Rebels in Prison Support (RIPS) are seeking volunteers to be prayer buddies to activists in prison.

RIPS assist people in prison whether on remand or serving time in prison from any non-violent campaign group, including Extinction Rebellion, Just Stop Oil,

Insulate Britain, Animal Rebellion, Stop HS2, as well as peace activists. Rebels usually have a prison buddy who helps support them including, for example, sending on emails, being in touch with family, sorting out any problems Prisoners clearly value their buddies and most buddies find it very rewarding. It's a very positive way of contributing, especially for those unable to take on a front line active role.

RIPS have asked CCA if we might be able to provide a different kind of support by becoming Prayer Buddies, either for those in prison or also for members of their family. Both may find the experience to be traumatic and might find it really helpful to be supported in this way. Contact might be by phone or email as agreed.

In addition, RIPS are working with the Climate Action Support Pathway (CASP) who are exploring whether it would be possible to offer emotional and psychological support from trained professionals either to those in prison or to their loved ones struggling outside.

Each Wednesday at 11.00am, when Parliament is sitting, members of CCA join in prayer vigil outside the gates. We'd love




