Pilgrimages of Protest as Britain Bakes in Record Heat



Last weekend (9th and 10th September) Christian Climate Action (CCA) and other climate activists took to the road to highlight the widespread public concern regarding the climate crisis. As parts of the UK baked in unseasonal temperatures exceeding 30°C, activists took part in 13 pilgrimages across the country.

Pilgrimage locations included Brighton, Bristol, Durham, Epson, Glasgow, Newbury, Merseyside, Oxford and York, with four pilgrimages also taking place in London. Further pilgimages are planned in London, Sunday 17th September (starting from St James, Piccadilly), and in Sheffield, Monday 18th September (from the Town Hall). Historically, pilgrimage has been used as a method of peaceful protest, and these pilgrimages focused on calling the Government to end oil and gas expansion. They also provided space and practice that allowed walkers to reflect on the climate crisis and our role within it.


NEW BOOK
