New homeless project opened in Birmingham

New National Shrine of St Oscar Romero

The Archdiocese of Southwark has announced that the Diocesan Shrine of St Oscar Romero at St George's Cathedral, Southwark, has been elevated to the status of a National Shrine for England and Wales. Following a petition to the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales by the Archbishop of Southwark, Archbishop John Wilson, unanimous approval was given to the new National Shrine at their recent Spring Plenary Meeting in Leeds.
