The Myanmar military continue to persecute and kill Christians including a Baptist Pastor.

The Govt of Nicaragua continues its persecution of Christians by shutting down 250 evangelical ministries.

In Nigeria Islamists abduct another 280 pupils, and murder a Pastor and his young family, whilst Fulani militants murder yet more Christians.

Russia has for some years been targeting Jehovah's Witnesses of whom nine are sentenced to between 3 and 7 years in prison.

In India a report by the EFI shows that the persecution of Christians continues to escalate whilst the state authorities in Assam aim to criminalize 'Praying for the Sick'.

There is a global review of attacks on Christians during February.

Some imagine that all this persecution of religious minorities only affects people living in far-off lands but that is not the case: in France another 58 Christian graves and churches are desecrated with Islamic graffiti.

In the UK a school chaplain who was sacked and reported to a terrorist watchdog for a moderate sermon questioning Stonewall's input to the children in his school is now appealing against a previous tribunal ruling after the same tribunal panel were found to expressed anti-Christian hate on social media.

An antisemitic bias in publishing is revealed – and an article by a Sikh asks why the British police seem uninterested in pursuing hate crimes against Christians whilst other religious groups are privileged?

There then follows and article considering *why* Christians experience hatred and persecuted in the West?

And then an article reviewing a recent psychological study of Compassion Fatigue?

The newsletter ends with a contact list of the NGOs that support the victims of persecution and whose websites document the tremendous work that they are doing – and how one may support their work and/or give donations.
