The Clewer Initiative's new resource for Lent 2022



Lent is a time of year when the Christian community pauses to reflect on what we have and how we can help others as well as remembering our Saviour's journey to the cross. Over the last couple of years, The Clewer Initiative has produced a Lent Resource which has been widely used by churches and individuals. In 2020, we launched the County Lines Lent Resource and in 2021, the Women in the Shadows Lent resource.

This year's new resource for Lent is called **Children in the Shadows**. Weekby-week, we explore the various forms of child exploitation in the UK and overseas, the scale of the abuse, some of the push factors and the need for us all to increase our awareness and effective response.

We have included contributions and insight from practitioners working in the areas of child trafficking, exploitation and safeguarding. This includes Ben Lindsay (the founder of <u>Power The Fight</u>), Becky Lewis, the Strategic Safeguarding and Quality Assurance Service Manager at Bristol City Council, Bill Crooks and Fiona Kendall of <u>FCEI-Mediterranean Hope</u> and the team at <u>Hestia</u>. Some of their reflections come in the form of short one minute film clips to inspire and guide discussion.






How do children get targeted?

Using art to connect with refugee children in Italy

In week 5 of Children in the Shadows, we provide a global perspective on children and modern slavery. As part of this, we spoke to The Clewer Initiative's trainer and facilitator, Bill Crooks about his new role in Italy, running community art workshops with refugee and migrant communities.



Calling healthcare professionals – have you heard of VITA?

VITA is a clinician-led organisation working to advance the health response to modern slavery human trafficking. VITA does this through VITA training, research, national and international advocacy and its growing VITA Network.

Dr Rosie Riley set up VITA five years ago. She explains: "Modern slavery and human trafficking is such an unknown within the health service. Research shows that we don't have effective training, we don't know what red flags to look for, we don't know about the scale, but much more importantly we don't know what to do when someone is sitting in front of us. What do I say, what do I not say, how do I get this accompanying person out of the room without them knowing I want to speak to the patient alone?"
