Healing Clinic an alternative way to health

Christians from various local churches are addressing the frustration many people are experiencing as a result of the long waiting times and treatment delays within the NHS.

Stirring of the Water Ministries, who have been based in Penryn for thirty years, are stepping out to help the people of Cornwall by holding monthly Healing Clinics in Penryn Town Hall.

Healing at the Healing Clinic is administered by volunteers through Christian prayer, as modelled by Jesus Christ in the Bible.

When Jesus walked on the earth He healed all who came to Him, and He does the same today.

The Healing Clinic volunteers continue Jesus' ministry by reaching out with the love of God, enabling healing and deliverance to be freely available to the people of Penryn and the surrounding areas.

The volunteer ministry team, experienced in providing healing

prayer, desire to help alleviate suffering caused by long-term sicknesses as well as physical and emotional pains.

During one of the clinics prayer was said for a lady with blood cancer. She told the volunteers that she was about to have a bone marrow check at the hospital. The following month she confirmed that, as a result of prayer, her blood was free of cancer.

Passers by have walked in off the street, received prayer, and encountered God's love. Some have returned the following month to receive further prayer.

The Healing Clinic is open to all on the first Saturday of each month between 10.30 and 13.00. No appointment is necessary.

The prayer given at the Penryn Healing Clinic is free, and completely confidential, just as it is in any Christian church.

Thanks as always for your wonderful support.

Due to the economic situation, we have a lot more clients, many of whom are working and still finding it hard to make ends meet and at the same time we are not receiving as many food donations as we did in recent times. It has therefore been necessary for us to purchase items in order to keep our shelves from being empty. This is unprecedented, and is not necessarily sustainable, so we would be grateful if you could spread the word on our behalf; just a couple of extra items will make a vast difference to us and our clients.

Here is an update of the items which are most needed:
