WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY 18th - 25th January 2026 "One body, one spirit"

For 2026, the prayers and reflections for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by the faithful of the Armenian Apostolic Church, along with their brothers and sisters of the Armenian Catholic and Evangelical Churches.

These resources draw upon centuries-old traditions of prayer and petitions used by the Armenian people, along with hymns that originated in the ancient monasteries and churches of Armenia, some of which date as far back as the fourth century.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2026 extends an invitation to draw upon this shared Christian heritage and to delve more deeply into our fellowship in Christ, which unites Christians worldwide.

Paul's epistles stress the importance of unity within the Church, urging us to live lives worthy of our calling with humility, gentleness, patience and love (Ephesians 4:1-3). Ephesians 4:4 summarises the teachings of Paul about unity, emphasising here, too, that the followers of Christ represent 'one body and one Spirit', united in a single hope. This metaphor signifies the Church as a unified entity transcending barriers of geography, nationality, ethnicity and tradition. Paul uses the metaphor of the Church being the Body of Christ to describe its unity within the diversity of its members.

Epiphany Chalk Blessing

Many churches are reviving the ancient tradition of chalking a blessing on the lintel of front doors. The letters C, M and B stand for the three wise men, Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar, and also for the Latin "Christus mansionem benedicat" ("Christ bless this house")



Galette De Rois

Just when you thought the opportunity for special seasonal food was over – it's great to see churches making traditional French Epiphany cakes this year to mark the season. Galette De Rois are made of puff pastry with frangipane or fruit filling, and a hidden coin that makes the finder king or queen for a day. People in France wear paper crowns to enjoy their galettes and it's traditional for the youngest person present to hide under the table and call out who should receive which slice – so no-one can cheat to get the coin! Truce or Ekecheiria, an ancient Greek tradition revived by the International Olympic Committee, calling for a global ceasefire during the Olympic Games to ensure safe passage and participation for athletes, promoting peace, dialogue, and unity through sport. The United Nations General Assembly adopted the resolution "Building a peaceful and better world through sport and the Olympic ideal" at its session in November 2025, supporting this ideal of "laying down of arms" from seven days before to seven days after the Games.
