

There's no charge for refreshments – though a donation is always gratefully received! There's also a Fairtrade stand, a Christian bookstall and activities for children. Chaplains from the group also go around the show to meet people, and on the hour back at the Churches Tent will say a prayer, offering people a moment of quiet reflection and spiritual togetherness, offering a space of sanctuary and rest from the bustling activity and excitement of the Royal Cornwall Agricultural Association's annual show.

The traditional Eve of Show Service will be at 6.30pm on Wed 7 June in the main ring, followed by a pasty reception in the Churches Together tent. Everyone is welcome, no tickets required.



A Thanksgiving Service will be held at King Charles the Martyr Church at 11am on Sunday 25 June with Bishop Hugh Nelson, Bishop of St Germans and Bishop to the Armed Forces.



Following last year's successful first effort at hosting a Book Sale to raise money for Christian Aid Week, Churches Together decided to repeat the venture this year! Having appealed for donations from all the churches across Falmouth and Penryn, The Salvation Army acted as a central drop-off point for donations and the Parish Church of King Charles the Martyr served as the venue for the sale once again. Books were sorted and set out on Monday 15 May, and the sale ran from Tuesday 16 to Saturday 20 May from 10.00am to 4.00pm each day.

Falmouth, Penryn and even Mawnan Smith helped to sell the books. One of the incidental benefits of the sale was that more people visited the church than might otherwise have done and were able to appreciate the peace and beauty of this fine church building.

By the end of the week, £651.50 had been raised for Christian Aid. There was still a considerable stock of unsold books which, hopefully, will be stored and form the core of the Book Sale next year. My thanks to all the church for their donations, to the church members who volunteered to sell the books and of course to the Church Council of King Charles Church for allowing Churches Together to use the church building. Hopefully, same time, same place next year!

As many of you know, Falmouth & Penryn Churches Together will be holding its AGM on Wednesday 19 July, at which a number of members of the existing Executive



will be relinquishing their posts. Rev Bill Stuart-White is retiring in June, Jane Charman is stepping down, I am vacating the Chair, and Pat Fitzpatrick is stepping down as Secretary. At present, there is no-one in sight who may take on

any of these roles. Unless we find some "new blood", there is a very real danger that Falmouth & Penryn Churches Together could simply cease to exist! The Executive is due to be replaced with a Steering Group made up of a representative from each member church — at present, we have NO representatives from most of the Churches! Please seek out a person from your Church family who can serve that role — without your participation in the running of FPCT, we cannot continue!
