



30 YEARS OF FAIRTRADE: The impact of choice

30 years ago three Fairtrade certified products: Chocolate, Tea and Coffee hit the supermarket shelves. Since then, Fairtrade has not only pioneered a unique, more equitable way of doing trade and shown how it makes a tangible difference, it has become the world's most recognised and trusted ethical label. Today there are over 6,000 Fairtrade products to choose from. Now it is much easier to find a good choice of Fairtrade goods in local supermarkets and stores. People are choosing to buy Fairtrade, choosing to buy products bearing the Fairtrade logo and the choices they make are saving lives. Fairtrade is one simple way of fighting the unfairness that keeps millions of farmers in poverty.

Falmouth Town Council chose to become a Fairtrade Town in 2005. A steering group was tasked with the aim of raising awareness of the importance of Fairtrade and trade justice, and although most of the original members have moved on, the present steering group still has the same aims.

As part of the 30 year celebrations, Fairtrade Falmouth is planning an initiative to engage with Falmouth and Penryn students as they revise for their exams. Because the initiative has a financial cost, we have done some fundraising ourselves completely. Falmouth Town Council recognising the importance of student engagement, has awarded a very generous grant to us to enable this initiative to go ahead. Thank you Falmouth Town Council, your support for our work is greatly appreciated.

We will be celebrating 30 years of Fairtrade with various events throughout 2024.
