#### **SEASON OF CREATION**

### 1<sup>st</sup> September – 4<sup>th</sup> October 2025

From September 1 to October 4, 2025, Christians around the world will unite to celebrate the Season of Creation, an annual time of prayer and action for our common home. This year's theme, "Peace with Creation" (Isaiah 32:14–18), calls communities to seek ecological justice and restoration amid a climate crisis.

The season encourages churches and individuals to host prayer services, plant gardens, advocate for climate and debt justice, and reflect on how faith leads us to healing relationships—with the Earth, with each other, and with God.

The newly released **Season of Creation 2025 Celebration Guide** offers 41 pages of resources including liturgies, prayer services, advocacy plans, creative ideas like community gardening, and promotional content for local groups.

## A SERVICE OF REFLECTION FOR THOSE AFFECTED BY SUICIDE

14th September 2025, 2pm

### Truro Cathedral, St Mary's St, Truro, TR1 2AF

This service provides an opportunity for all those affected by suicide to come together in a safe and supportive space to remember those they have lost.

All are welcome – of all faiths or none – to this special event.

Held on the closest weekend to World Suicide Prevention Day, under the shared umbrella of "Time Together" with a similar service held on the same weekend as St Martin-in-the-Fields in London, Manchester Cathedral and in Leicester, in recognition and support of a wider community of those who are bereaved.

The Celtic Male Ensemble will provide choral music, with a performance by the Singing for Wellbeing group for those bereaved by suicide.

Refreshments will be provided after the service in the Chapter House and there will be an opportunity to meet with those who offer support services in the community.

Created by a group of courageous Christian women from Nigeria, these self-portraits were painted as part of a trauma healing programme after they experienced violent attacks for their faith. Many include golden tears — a striking symbol of how God can bring hope, dignity and healing out of deep pain.

Alongside their own artwork, you'll see beautiful portraits by British artist **@hannahrosethomas**, who worked with the women to honour their stories through art.

This free Tears of Gold exhibition is part of the @OpenDoorsUK *See. Change.* campaign, which shines a light on the unique persecution faced by Christian women around the world.

Dear Friends,

We hope this message finds you well. As always, we deeply appreciate your unwavering support for our community.

Sadly we continue to see a steady increase in people needing emergency food parcels.

**Challenging Times:** Due to the current economic situation, we have a lot more clients, many of whom are working and still finding it hard to make ends meet.

Our Response: To address this urgent need, we continue to purchase essential items ourselves. The average weekly food shop costs us £450 a

week (roughly £1800 a month), so this is not a sustainable solution. We rely on the generosity of our community to keep our food bank operational, therefore we would ask that you can spread the word on our behalf, which we would really appreciate.

How You Can Help: Every small contribution makes a significant difference. If you can spare a little extra, it will go a long way in supporting those who rely on our service. We are extremely short of the following supplies at the moment:

- Tinned fruit
- Pasta Sauce jars
- Sugar
- Tinned meat
- Semi skimmed long life milk
- Tuna
- Meat soup/ Veg soup
- Coffee
- Tinned potatoes
- Tinned hot dogs
- Tinned meatballs
- Bottles of squash
- Cans of 'pop' e.g. coca cola, lemonade etc (we give out individual cans for the single boxes)
- Tinned tomatoes
- Baked beans
- Essential toiletries, particularly deodorant
