Lenten Message from our Chair, the Rt Rev Rob Wickham

My friends,

Have you ever prayed the Stations of the Cross? It is a powerful spiritual journey of the final moments of Jesus' life, where Jesus was thinking about you, and those around you.

In this walk he is unfairly judged, he falls three times, he is helped by strangers, he is publicly humiliated and eventually he is killed and laid in a tomb. Jesus, again, showing the depths that God will go to as a demonstration of unconditional love.

Who else has a similar experience? Condemned by strangers, humiliated, fall, and some will die in the process? Who else is desperate for the kindness of the stranger?

The number of refugees in London sleeping rough has increased by 39% in a month, and those who have been granted asylum are often evicted with nowhere to go.

Housing Justice has recently launched a Refugee Lodgings Scheme, bringing together those who are in need and those who have a room, for up to six months, so they can start to re-build their lives. This is life transforming. This is Lent and Easter in action.

So, as you journey in Stations of the Cross, as Jesus journeys with you, and you journey with Jesus, look around. Who else is journeying, who else is facing that which Jesus faced, who else needs that helping hand in a moment of desperate need? Easter is God's 'yes' to us. How might we be God's 'yes' to one another?
