FAIR TRADE

£30 million in Fair Trade Premiums is being invested in local led community projects.

In 2023,30,000 people took action in Fair Trade campaigning for more equal global trade rules. 20,000 signed petitions for trade and climate justice, writing to MPs and sharing messages from poor farmers. This showed politicians that grass roots support for climate justice can't be ignored.

40 universities are working towards Fair Trade status.

600 Schools have been awarded Fair Trade Status.

THE NORTH OF IRELAND

Last year was the first year since records began in 1969 that there were no security related incidents recorded.

NEURODIVERGENT ADULTS

Only about 30 % of adults are in work.

Job prospects should improve as special employment centres are to be set up.
