ANGER AT GREEN LIGHT FOR NEW UK OILFIELD

Britain gave the go ahead to develop the UK's biggest untapped oilfield, off Shetland, sparking outrage from environmental campaigners. The oil and gas regulator's decision to allow Oslo-listed Equinor and British firm Ithaca to develop the Rosebank field was condemned by Green MP Caroline Lucas as "the greatest act of environmental vandalism in my lifetime."
