RECYCLING REVOLUTION

Local authorities currently set their own rules on recycling. Ministers have now set out plans to ensure all councils collect the same core types of recycling. Items refused by some councils will soon be eligible to be included in all household recycling. From 2023 households will also get weekly food collections with free compostable caddy liners supplied. More recycling waste will be processed locally rather than being shipped to countries like Malaysia.
