Wales has introduced an agricultural reform that responds to the climate crisis.

The new Agricultural Bill pays farmers for enhancing ecosystems and conserving the countryside, planting trees, habitat protection and sustainable food production.

SOUTH SUDAN

is one of the countries in the Horn of Africa where 20 million people are at risk of starvation. Recently floods in S. Sudan meant the that trucks bringing essential supplies of food and other goods got stuck in the mud for a month and the markets were empty. Thankfully they are on the move again now.

IRAN

Young women and schoolgirls have been protesting in their thousands against the laws impeding the dignity and freedom of women under the Islamic regime. One young person has died in custody, which has created more anger and violence.

THE NOBEL PEACE PRIZE

has been awarded to peace activists in Russia, Belarus and Ukraine

PRISON SUNDAY

was last Sunday. A small NGO called "PRISONERS ABROAD" is the only organisation providing essential help. There are over 700 prisoners, some in dreadful prisons, with infestations, no room to lie down, no safe water to drink, no decent food, unable to speak or understand the language and undergoing incarceration to months before a trial.

Prisoners Abroad provides material help and friendship, supports their families and children here in the UK and is a ray of hope and alight in the darkness, Contact the organisation if you would like to know more and also send a Christmas card to a British prisoner somewhere alone and forgotten in our world.
