WORLD BOOK DAY AND ITS IMPORTANCE

World Book Day is celebrated on the first Thursday of March. On this day every child and young person in full time education receives a book voucher to buy a book for themselves. The aim of the day is to promote reading for pleasure, thereby changing lives. Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success, more than

family circumstances, parent's education and income.

UNESCO started World Book Day in 1995, now over 100 countries participate. In the UK, only 25% of Children read for pleasure daily. Half a million have no book of their own and one in five who have free school meals don't own a book. Booksellers and publishers donate towards the scheme which is a registered charity.

HAITI

Chaos reigns, with armed gangs rampaging the streets with breakdown of government and infrastructure, ordinary people living in fear of their lives.

NIGERIA

In the last week over 300 children have been kidnapped and taken from their schools. Pray that the children will be found and returned to their families unhurt.

ISRAEL

has expanded settlements at a record rate, a UN report has found, amounting to a war crime. Settler violence and settlement-related violations have reached shocking new levels. Israel plans to build nearly 3,500 settler homes in occupied Palestinian territory.

CHINA

Surveillance technology. 1.3 billion people are under constant surveillance by 2.1million facial recognition cameras. Every church has these cameras. For children churches are off limits. The communist party has declared war against Christians. Many church leaders have been arrested. Those who talk to foreigners are accused of being a threat to national security.

Much to reflect upon and pray abut this week, especially for those persecuted for their faith, and for the restoration of Law and Order in Haiti and Nigeria.
