MALARIA VACCINE

- It is a truly historic moment that the WHO has given the go-ahead for the roll out for Africa of the first ever Malaria vaccine.
- 94% of the global 229 million cases a year are in Africa and children are disproportionally affected, with 260,000 deaths a year.

INTELLECTUAL DISABILITY

• THE CONGO BASIN

 The Congo basin forest in West Africa makes such heavy rain, making it one of the richest and most valuable ecosystems on the planet. The consequences of cutting down the forest are that it will quite literally dry up the water supplies of millions of people. That means no more water or food in Ethiopia, 124 million people.

• CHARITIES DEMAND RETHINK ON FOREIGN AID CUTS

Aid charities have accused chancellor Rishi Sunak of attempting to mount a "stealth raid" on British foreign aid spending, squeezing the aid budget and that the new items will be designated as "overseas development assistance" in a way that would cut the amount spent directly on humanitarian aid. The government is already cutting overseas assistance from 0.7 per cent of national income to 0.5 per cent.

- October 10 to 16 is Prisoners Week. There are 279 thousand people in prison in this country, the highest ratio in Europe.
- Many are underprivileged and have been in the care system. Their families suffer a sentence as well, and there are 90,000 thousand children with a parent in prison.
