# THE CURRENT RISING NUMBER OF UNION STRIKES AFFECTING ESSENTIAL SERVICES IN THE COUNTRY

Needed is a solution which takes into account the dignity and value of work, including the right to strike, and the economic situation in this country.

NB Carers do not have a Union and are paid only about a £10 an hour; there is a shortage of 165,000 carers in this country. It is more lucrative to stock shelves in the supermarket!

### **NHS**

Need not just for extra money but for an efficient and effective reorganisation of its present structure, including new initiatives.

### **RESEARCH CONFIRMS DUCHY HARD TIMES**

Cornwall Community Foundation's research, carried out with the University of Exeter, highlights a high level of deprivation, rural isolation, lack of opportunities and an increasingly alarming shortage of affordable and social housing.

In Cornwall, a fulltime worker earns 79 % of the UK gross median annual salary.

- 26% earned under the living wage, compared with 17% nationally.
- 20% are self employed, compared to just 13% in the UK.
- 49% of those self-employed earn less than the minimum wage.
