GOOD NEWS

THE WORLD'S FIRST FLOATING CITY

Construction is underway in the Maldives to build a trailblazing floating city to house 20,000 as a solution to rising sea levels and an overcrowded capital city. This futuristic feat of architecture will be completed by 2027.

WINNERS OF THE GLOBAL GOOD AWARD

In Dorset drones and Artificial Intelligence were used to identify and map different types of litter on beaches and urban spaces.

Glowing bins, funded by McDonald's, have reduced the amount of litter by 75%. This idea will now be tried in Glasgow.

EUROPEAN UNION

New builds in EU countries will now have to have solar panels. Due to the war in Ukraine, EU countries have been turning away from Russian gas supplies. Part of this includes a switch to renewable energy, with plans for half of the energy being renewable by 2030. A new solar rooftop initiative has made it mandator for all new buildings to have solar panels by 2029.

There will be a GCSE in Natural History for 14 to 16 year olds from 2025. Pupils will develop a vigorous understanding of the natural world from their own local wildlife environment and ecosystems to critical global challenges such as climate change and sustainability.

MODERN DAY SLAVERY HIDDEN IN PLAIN SIGHT

October 18th was Anti-Slavery Day. More than 200 years after the abolition of Slavery there are an estimated 40.3 million men, women and children trapped in Modern Slavery.

In 2020 there were 31 Modern Slavery and human Trafficking cased reported in Cornwall.
