GOOD NEWS

- In France Domestic Flights are to be banned on routes that can be done in two and a half hours by train.
- Good Energy has taken environmentalist teenagers on to its Advisory Board.
 Choosing clean power is one of the biggest things you can do to tackle climate change. Good Energy produces 100% electricity from wind, Gas is 10% biogas from organic matter and the rest is offset from carbon reduction schemes, sun and water.
- Engineers have developed the whitest, coolest paint ever recorded, which reflects 98% of sunlight. It may be possible with this to reduce the need for air conditioning.
- 2020 was the third good year in a row for Butterflies.

FOR PRAYER AND REFLECTION

- In Myanmar, soldiers are compelled to use their arms against innocent civilians. If failing to do so they are likely to face death themselves.
- International Human Rights Commissioners have called for the removal of the barbed wire fence surrounding the camps for Rohingya refuges which entrapped thousands during the fire which swept through Cox's Bazaar on 27th March, leaving 15 dead and 45 thousand homeless.
- US immigrants are creating a humanitarian challenge: as many as 550
 unaccompanied minors a day recorded. The Trump Administration in the
 closing months of his presidency, illegally expelled tens of thousands of
 unaccompanied youths and children, leaving Joe Biden to attempt to honour
 the obligation to receive children as a measure of humanity.
