ROYAL NATIONAL LIFEBOAT INSTITUTION

This year is celebrating its 200th anniversary. Our local lifeboat is frequently called for variety of emergencies from people on the cliffs cut off by the incoming tide, capsized vessels, people stuck in the mud and vessels in distress. Here in Cornwall, people remember that awesome night when the entire crew of the Penlee lifeboat lost their lives on a stormy night emergency callout.

Thousands of lives have been saved by the courage and bravery of our lifeboat crews.

is an organisation which continues to raise awareness of religious freedom violations through their work with journalists, human rights defenders and communities in the countries in which they work.

More recently they have held training courses for journalists in Mexico and Nigeria to improve their reporting. Trainings have been effective in bringing together the government, people affected by violations and journalists.

CSW are optimistic that the new awareness created will lead to journalists making a positive impact in their states.

CSW in 2017 was granted United Nations accreditation and are listened to as they report in their advocacy role.
