#### **FALMOUTH FOOD CO-OP**

Recently celebrated the delivery of 5,000 meals for members of the community from their kitchen at the Princess Pavilion. All the food preparation and delivery is done by volunteers and the community garden in in Penryn provides fresh ingredients. Meals are available at no cost to those in need in the community. A 95-year-old neighbour of mine benefitted recently. Some of the recipients enjoy meeting the delivery person who may be the only person they see that day.

#### RENEWABLE ENERGY

The International Energy Agency predicts that for the first-time global investment in solar energy will eclipse investment in oil.

#### **BRAZIL**

Deforestation in Brazil's Amazon rainforest fell 68% in April from the previous year, preliminary government data shows. This is a positive development for the President Luiz who won last year's election pledging to end deforestation after years of destruction under his predecessor.

#### **SCHOOL MEALS IN LONDON**

Every schoolchild in London will receive free school meals over the next academic year. The £130m initiative was launched by the Mayor of London to ease the cost of living crisis.

It is expected to save families £440 per child during the 2023-2034 academic year.
