

Justice & Peace Weekly Bulletin: 24 February 2021

GOOD NEWS

- The President of Colombia has announced temporary protection status to the 1.7 million migrants and refugees from Venezuela. They will be able to access health care and employment.
- The Government has announced plans to reform the NHS and Social Services to enable better coordination and support for patients (especially needed in enabling packages of care for those ready to be discharged from hospital).
- There has been a very good response for the plea for iPads and computers, old or new, to enable
 families with several siblings to do their online learning. In some families 3 children are using one
 phone only.
 - Falmouth Primary Academy needs 40 computers. See <u>www.ctcinfohub.org/laptops</u> for updates and how to donate.
- An alternative plan has been announced for the old M and S site, for a waterside hub, with waterside frontage, food hall and gym, rather than more Flats.
- UK and Ghana have reached agreement on a trade deal that will remove damaging tariffs on bananas resulting from Brexit that threatens ruin for many farmers.

FOR REFLECTION AND PRAYER

- The Cornish Fishing Industry needs new ways to adapt to the problems with export of fish to the EU, now problematic with Brexit agreements. To aid sales, spider crabs are to be renamed Cornish Kings.
- The EU is turning a blind eye to trade deals with human rights violations in China.
 - In the UK, in Parliament, the Lords is still attempting to get a motion passed so that we do
 not do trade deals with nations guilty of genocide and human rights abuses.
- Food poverty is increasing. Food banks are a temporary help to families in need but not the full answer.
- The £20 extra given in Universal Credit is soon to be withdrawn. How can we take action to prevent this?
