

Making the most of Safeguarding Sunday

Safeguarding Sunday (19th November) is an annual awareness raising

campaign for churches run by the charity <u>Thirtyone:eight</u> and coincides with the start of Safeguarding Adults Week (20–24 November).

It provides churches with a perfect opportunity to highlight and celebrate the good work that is being done behind the scenes to protect vulnerable people.

Last year, churches reported that as a result of Safeguarding Sunday, they saw:

• greater positive awareness and understanding of safeguarding among church members

• an increase in the number of people feeling able to talk about their abuse for the first time


• more volunteers coming forward for safeguarding roles and to help with children's and youth work

• an increased number of people completing safeguarding training and criminal record checks

• a greater number of Safeguarding Leads feeling supported in their role by the church.

Equipping Parish Safeguarding Officers (PSO) to learn more about modern slavery and championing the importance of having good safeguarding policies in place in the fight against exploitation are key priorities for The Clewer Initiative. Over the last few years, we have delivered training to dozens of PSOs and created a raft of bespoke resources.




What does the Bible teach about child protection and safeguarding?

develop a robust theology around safeguarding and caring for children and young people.

Discussing these passages together in the lead up to Safeguarding Sunday could be a good way to get people thinking about our God-given responsibility.

2. A bespoke PSO Newsletter

The Clewer Initiative publishes a special newsletter for Parish and Cathedral Safeguarding Officers every two months to help equip PSOs with the tools and resources to respond to modern slavery through their roles.

3. A regular online forum for PSOs

We run Forums for Parish Safeguarding Officers who have attended our Modern Slavery and Safeguarding Training. At these online forums, we discuss an area of modern slavery and safeguarding, share good practice and meet with other PSOs from across The Church of England.

4. A webpage for PSOs

We've created a page on our website especially for Parish Safeguarding Officers (PSO). It contains all of our resources which we believe can equip PSOs in their vital work.

Pioneering anti-slavery action in the Diocese of Leeds Last month, The Clewer Initiative and Wellsprings Together brought together dozens of frontline community workers and faith leaders, as well as representatives from the local authority, NHS and Police, to consider how to tackle modern slavery in Bradford and beyond.

Siaa-Liane Mathurin, a Parish Development Worker for Wellsprings Together, explains: "When we began planning the event with The Clewer Initiative, we imagined the room would be full of Church of England vicars. Wonderfully, we underestimated what we could achieve and have in fact welcomed many members of the Sikh, Muslim, Buddhist and Christian communities of Bradford as well as people of no faith. This is really important because if we are going to tackle modern slavery effectively, we need a joined-up approach."






A flying visit
