New animation and guide offer tips for churches to reach net zero carbon

Churches can find practical and easy tips to help them reach net zero in a new animation and guide launched this week.

The short two minute <u>animation</u>, using 'claymatian' style characters, highlights steps such as insulating pipes, draught-proofing doors and buying heated seat cushions to help churches on their journey to net zero carbon.

The animation has been launched alongside a <u>digital practical guide</u> which features a handy flowchart, a list of heating solutions and a checklist.

The new resources, produced by the Church of England's Net Zero programme, are aimed at helping churches lower carbon emissions by 2030 - an ambition set by the Church of England in 2020.

Public ownership of Water

Zero Hour have a new campaign and are asking support of our MPs. Zero Hour state:

We all depend on water. It's a basic necessity, a shared resource, and vital to the health of our environment. But right now, we have no say in how it's managed.

For decades, private water companies have put their profits before people and planet—hiking our water bills, polluting our rivers, and failing to invest in our future. The result? A water system in crisis, spiralling debt, and the public left to pick up the tab. But it doesn't have to be this way.

On 28 March, MPs will debate Clive Lewis' Water Bill in Parliament. It's an opportunity to start a long overdue conversation about how we manage this essential resource. Clive's private member's bill calls for a Commission to explore all models of ownership through a citizens' assembly, giving us, the public, a voice in shaping the future of Britain's water system.

We need as many MPs as possible to attend and take this seriously on 28 March. Ask your MP to attend the crucial debate on the future of our water HERE
