

News from Edinburgh.

(Received mid-August).

“Dear Fr Nikitas and members of the Community of The Holy Archangel Michael and Holy Piran.

Talk about things not going smoothly with a move. We had been talking about possibly moving up to Scotland to join living with Deacon Joseph and Deaconess Loukia as we are both getting older and having to cope with health problems. Well all our planning was taken out of our hands when on 21 March I tripped on a paving stone in Falmouth and ended up with a nasty fracture of my one hip and nine weeks in hospital.

Our two daughters took over all the planning and two weeks after leaving hospital in Truro we were on an aeroplane to Edinburgh. We had been here two weeks when I developed an acute gallbladder infection and the surgeons felt that this should be removed immediately. So more time in hospital and more delays in getting myself ambulant. My legs had lost their strength and I kept falling. I am only just beginning to walk using two walking sticks, before then it was with a walking frame, my long stay in hospital. Loukia had arranged all sorts of things medically for us so immediately we arrived we were linked in with a GP Group. The other health care has been fantastic. I have had a weekly visit from a physiotherapist.


So we rest in God's plans for us. It is going to still be a number of months before I am fully mobile. Asking for your prayers as we in turn continue to pray for you. We had been in the Church since 2010, almost nine years to the day of my fall!

I have linked up with Fr Raphael at St Andrew's Orthodox Church in Edinburgh who I have had contact since about 2000. He helped me in my early Ordination days when I spent a week with him.

CONGRATULATIONS AND MANY YEARS to His Grace Bishop Chrysostomos of Kyanea who, on Wednesday 10th July, the Holy Synod of the Ecumenical Patriarchate elevated to **Metropolitan of Helioupolis and Thira**. Bishop Chrysostomos was born on the island of Naxos in 1927. Having first completed a degree in Law, he graduated from the School of Theology of the University of Athens in 1952. Ordained to the diaconate in 1952, the priesthood in 1954, on December 19th 1970, he was consecrated Bishop of Kyanea and has been based at the Cathedral of St. Andrew the Apostle, Kentish Town, London.
