Six months missing: Where are they?

Carmen and Lesbia are religious leaders in Nicaragua. They were detained on 10 August 2024 and haven't been seen or heard from since.

Colombia: Too risky to pray

In areas of Colombia with a presence of illegal armed and criminal groups, the threat to life for religious leaders is so high that even holding an extended time of prayer can be incredibly dangerous.

One pastor, who represents more than 50 churches, recently called for a 40-day season of prayer and fasting to end the violence in his city. But local church leaders were fearful of the reprisals that would no doubt come.
