What is Talk Learn Do (TLD)?

TLD is a programme that encourages and supports parents of 3–11-year-olds to talk to their children about money and create opportunities for their children to experience managing it. The programme provides parents with tools, ideas, and fun activities to help include money in everyday conversations and activities.

The needs of children aged 12-17 are very different from younger children, however, and they will need to learn different things, possibly in different ways. Parents may well need quite different support to do this. The consultation we are running for the older phase of TLD is geared to providing the learning that can underpin design of appropriate support for parents and young people.

The Money and Pensions Service is working with Quaker Social Action to generate this learning in England.
