Equipping frontline workers at residential care setting in Cumbria

The Clewer Initiative recently delivered its County Lines Train the Trainer sessions to 25 team members of A Wilderness Way.

A Wilderness Way (AWW) is one of the country's leading providers of residential care, health and education for children who have suffered trauma and exploitation. Its centres provide a warm, safe and therapeutic environment where children, who are vulnerable and in crisis, can grow and develop and reframe their beliefs.

Sarah Glencross, the Learning and Development Coordinator at AWW, contacted The Clewer Initiative to see if it could provide county lines training for some of her colleagues.

Supporting Preston's Street Pastors

<u>Preston & South Ribble Street Pastors</u> started their ministry in 2008. They patrol Preston City Centre every Saturday night and some Friday nights, ensuring the homeless are looked after and spending time with people who are leaving pubs and clubs. They aim to "care for, listen to and help people who are out on the streets."

Patrols are drawn from a 40 strong team which is coordinated by Paul Blackett. Paul was aware that the drug scene is always changing and felt that it was important to find current training for his team. He saw an advert for the **County Lines Train the Trainer** session in The Clewer Initiative's monthly newsletter and thought it could be a perfect fit for the Street Pastors. He attended the training in February 2021 and has been benefitting from the knowledge ever since.

Our county lines schools resource

The Clewer Initiative has produced lesson plans for schools and youth leaders to raise awareness of the nature of county lines. The sessions include information, activities and case studies that show the scale of this crime as well as the impact it has on children, families and communities.

The Clewer Initiative's Secondary School material consists of three, one hour sessions and includes everything a teacher will need. The lessons can be taught over three individual weeks or adapted for a particular context.

The material has been developed in collaboration with Cumbria Police and reviewed and approved by the Education Board in Cumbria. It was piloted across the county of Cumbria in various secondary schools and PRUs.


2024 & beyond
