Use Journeys to learn more about modern slavery

Every modern slavery journey is different.

Some people are targeted in their bedrooms in suburbia, others on a busy street in Vietnam or an internet cafe in Albania. Many British victims are

approached when they are already struggling with other vulnerabilities such as homelessness or school exclusion. Similarly, every volunteer and campaigner has a different journey. In *Journeys*, we tell these stories - the stories of victims and volunteers.

Our *Journeys* resource consists of five mini films and two written resources - a faith-based devotional for churches and individuals to use during Lent and a resource for schools, businesses, charities, statutory and community organisations to use at any time of the year.

The written resources will help you reflect on the films and include searching questions, case studies, background information and suggestions for action. The Lent resource also contains a short Bible study, the Gospel reading for the following Sunday and a prayer to draw our discussions together.

Journeys consists of:

- Five mini-films (containing victim stories and interviews with frontline volunteers and experts)
- A Lent resource for churches and individuals
- A separate resource for schools, businesses, charities, statutory and community organisations

- 30 vivid drawings to inspire discussion
- Written contributions from the National Crime Agency, the Gangmasters and Labour Abuse Authority, the Bishop of London and the former Bishop of Derby, Alastair Redfern
- Interviews with representatives from Hestia, the Pan Lancashire Anti-Slavery Partnership; Southend Against Modern Slavery; the Federation of Protestant Churches in Italy, the Diocese of Gloucester and The Clewer Initiative
- Five testimonies of victims trapped in labour exploitation, county lines, financial exploitation and domestic servitude. Their stories are portrayed by actors.

Compelling new artwork to help us journey together

Central to our new resource *Journeys* are the "Stations of the Cross." Each week, Bishop Alastair Redfern, Chair of The Clewer Initiative, poses searching questions to help participants reflect on Jesus' final day and notice the parallels with the journeys of many modern slavery victims.

To help steer our meditations, Bill Crooks, an artist and facilitator for The Clewer Initiative, has created 30 new images – 15 traditional stations of the cross and 15 contemporary interpretations.

By considering the two sets of images, side by side, we hope people will be able to see with fresh eyes the injustice, loneliness and cruelty of the journey victims often take.

Richard and Danny's story of Financial Exploitation



In *Journeys*, five actors and actresses bring to life the stories of five victims of modern slavery. In Week 3, we hear from Richard, a father of a modern slavery victim. His story is unusual because it involves financial exploitation, a form of modern slavery that is less well known.

We interviewed the police force involved in the case and they explained more: "When we investigated the evidence, it became clear this local teenager had got sucked into an extremely, dark and complex serious crime organisation. Criminals are working across the world, luring teenagers and vulnerable adults into unseen crime and leaving them frightened and trapped.

"We are seeing a lot more cases of financial exploitation where people are tricked into going into debt and then held in bondage. Once gangs have a hold over individuals, they apply huge pressure, threats and blackmail and coerce them into online crime."

FEAST DAY OF SAINT JOSEPHINE BAKHITA

8 FEBRUARY

Travelling to Rome for St. Bakhita's Day

February 8th is the Feast of St. Josephine Bakhita, a Sudanese nun who was kidnapped and sold into slavery as a child. After years of enslavement, she was eventually granted freedom and became a member of the Canossian Sisters in Italy.

Today she is known as the patron saint of human trafficking and 8th February marks <u>The International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human</u> <u>Trafficking</u> when St Bakhita is remembered as a symbol of the Church's commitment against the issue.

The day provides an opportunity for churches and individuals to come together in solidarity and prayer for victims caught up in slavery across the world. It is facilitated by **Talitha Kum**, an international network of sisters which operates in five continents to take action against the issue and care for those affected.

This year, on the 9th anniversary of the international day, 20 young representatives of organisations partnering with Talitha Kum will be travelling to Rome for a week of networking and training against human trafficking. The Clewer Initiative is excited to be sending a representative to take part in the week of events.
