Stop 1 (Emmanuel Baptist Church) **Reflection and Worship**

Stop 2 (All Saints) **Jesus is condemned to death.**

While Pilate was sitting on the judge's seat, his wife sent him this message: "Don't have anything to do with that innocent man". But Pilate washed his hands in front of the crowd and handed Jesus over to be crucified.

Stop 3 (St Mary's) **Jesus is made to carry his cross and falls under it.**

Stop 6 (Falmouth Methodist Church) **Jesus speaks to the women of Jerusalem.**

"Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children."
"If you had only known on this day what would bring you peace!"
